Meditate:

Scripture: Isaiah 43:7

Isaiah 43 is a prophetic book written by the prophet Isaiah during a period when the Israelites were in exile in Babylon. The book focuses on God's faithfulness and His plans for His people even in the midst of their suffering and captivity.

In Isaiah 43, God speaks to the Israelites through the prophet, assuring them of His deliverance and restoration. He reminds them of His identity as the Creator and the One who has chosen them as His people. God declares His authority to define their purpose and promises to be with them through all challenges and trials.

I. The CREATOR gets to DEFINE the PURPOSE of his creation

When Graham Bell invented the telephone, it revolutionized communication in ways unimaginable. He defined the purpose of his creation, and it served its intended function. In a similar manner, God, as the ultimate Creator, has the authority to define the purpose of every living being. Just as a telephone fulfills its purpose when used as Bell intended, we find fulfillment when we align ourselves with God's purpose for our lives.

II. The CREATOR is always OUTSIDE HIS creation

Unlike Bell, who was limited by his own creation, God transcends His creation. This means that we, as creatures, cannot fully define our own purpose. While we may have desires and aspirations, our true purpose can only be discovered by seeking the mind and will of our Creator. When we recognize that God is outside of His creation, we are humbled, acknowledging that He has a higher perspective and understanding of our purpose.

III. Embracing the Creator's Design Leads to Fulfilling Purpose

God created us with intention and purpose. He uniquely crafted each one of us for His glory, as stated in Isaiah 43:7.
