Topic: Trusting God's Guidance

Opening Prayer:

Read: Joshua 9

Have you ever made a decision that seemed right at the moment but later proved to be a mistake? The story in Joshua 9 is a vivid reminder of the importance of seeking God's guidance in every decision we make.

The Israelites, fresh from their victories in Jericho and Ai, encountered the Gibeonites. The Gibeonites, fearing for their lives, resorted to deception. They dressed in worn-out clothes and carried moldy bread to appear as if they had come from a distant land. Joshua and the leaders of Israel, failing to seek counsel from the Lord, believed their story and made a peace treaty with them.

A noteworthy Hebrew word in this passage is "darash" (דָּרַשׁ), which means to seek, inquire, or consult. Joshua 9:14 says, "So the men took some of their provisions, but did not ask counsel from the Lord." This lack of seeking ("darash") God's guidance led to a hasty and misguided decision.

This narrative teaches us the importance of discernment and reliance on God. It wasn't the external appearance of the Gibeonites that should have guided Israel's decision but rather a consultation with God. When we face decisions, especially those that seem straightforward or insignificant, it's easy to rely on our judgment. However, God invites us to seek His wisdom in everything. Practical application from this story is to make it a habit to seek God's guidance in our daily lives. Whether it's a major life decision or a routine choice, inviting God into the process helps us align our actions with His will. Prayer, reading Scripture, and seeking wise counsel are practical ways to involve God in our decisions.

Conclusion:

The account of the Gibeonites serves as a powerful reminder to always seek God's guidance. By making a habit of consulting Him, we can avoid unnecessary mistakes and walk more confidently in His will.
